Structure, Governance and Management

The Northern Cricket Union of Ireland is a charitable company limited by guarantee, directed by a board comprising the Trustees.

Objectives and Activities

The charity's objective is to promote and improve cricket generally in the North of Ireland among males and females, able-bodied and disabled, through:

- Promoting the playing of cricket and supporting the development of cricket clubs;
- Running men's, women's, boys' and girls' league and cup competitions for clubs and schools; and
- Organising interprovincial teams in a range of age-groups and providing coaching and fitness training for the associated regional development squads.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

This year the management and staff team increased by two thanks to additional matched funding from Ulster University. James Cameron-Dow and Mike Grossett both provided part-time support as Cricket Development Officers for Community and Clubs and for Student Participation and Club Development. We are also grateful to Cricket Ireland and Sport Northern Ireland for their financial support which goes some way towards helping the delivery of the Union's strategy.

Unfortunately, the spread of the COVID 19 pandemic in Northern Ireland in the first quarter of 2020 and the resultant lockdown followed by restrictions severely impacted the cricket season. Promotion and relegation were abandoned but a series of 20 over cup and league competitions commenced in July 2020 and were much enjoyed and well supported. Whilst the Men's Challenge Cup could not be held the Women's Challenge Cup was eagerly competed for with Waringstown finishing as winners.

However, the pandemic meant there was no schools or youth cricket and only a truncated season of youth representative games.

For the MTB Northern Knights as with the other representative sides it proved to be a frustrating year. Fewer fixtures could be arranged for the season and even they were badly affected by the weather in late summer.

There was also great disappointment when the much-anticipated arrival of the New Zealand side for matches against Ireland at Stormont became a casualty of COVID and the trip was cancelled.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Results for the period ended 31 March 2021 are provided in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 7 of the financial statements. A summary of the assets and liabilities as at 31 March 2021 are provided in the Balance Sheet on pages 8 and 9. The financial statements should be read in conjunction with their related notes, which appear on pages 10 to 20.

The results for the year reflect a total surplus of £51,984. Of this, a total of £37,103 relates to grant income received in 2020-21, where programmes were not completed in the year. These funds have been released to the profit and loss account in accordance with the Charities SORP. The associated costs are expected to be incurred in the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The Board continue to focus on developing new and increased sponsorships opportunities for the Union as well as other sources of funding, with the aim of furthering its core objectives in to the future.

Despite the pandemic the Union's sponsors were generous in their support of the competitions that took place. Nonetheless COVID had an impact on revenues although with fewer costs and some government support it is not expected to have a material impact on the financial position of the Union.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31 March 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The particular accounting policies adopted by the Directorate are described below.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of fixed asset investments which are held at market value.

The financial statements are prepared in pounds sterling which is the function currency of the charity.

This entity is a Public Benefit Entity.

Fund Accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes.

General funds may be transferred to designate funds where Trustees wish to use these funds for a specific purpose. Such funds may be transferred back to general funds once the criteria for the designation have been met and are no longer applicable.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of restricted funds is set out in the notes to the financial statements. Restricted funds may only be transferred to general or designated funds once the criteria for restriction have been discharged or no longer apply.

Income Resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Grants, service agreement, fee income and grants for equipment are recognised in the SOFA in the period in which they are receivable.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31 March 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES continued

Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Tangible fixed assets

The cost of assets comprises purchase price and any installation charges.

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are held at fair value and movements in fair value are recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
